An Inconvenient Tax sheds light on one of America's messiest problems—a fundamentally broken tax code affecting every aspect of people's lives. To help crack the code, the film uses the country's top economic experts, commentators, and political voices. For the first time ever, Americans can engage in the tax debate with confidence and perhaps discover a new way to tax. As Joseph Thorndike, one of the film's experts, says, "We face fiscal problems in this country right now that are so serious, we should all fear for the safety of our children down the road. Americans are going to have to deal with this topic of tax reform because it is just too important to ignore."
