PhD Position (Doctoral Researcher) for a 30-hour/week position at the Department of Economics (to December 12th 2024) starting as soon as possible

The research project "Earnings volatility and labor market volatility in Austria" is headed by René Böheim (JKU Linz) and funded by the Austrian Nationalbank (OeNB). The project focuses on three main questions, how individuals' earnings and labor market attachment vary over time, over their lives, and how their social position affect their children. The place of employment is Linz, but flexible work arrangements are possible. Payment is according to the FWF's salary guidelines for doctoral candidates. The candidate is expected to study towards a PhD in the department's PhD-program which is organized jointly with the University of Innsbruck.

- contribute to the research project "Earnings volatility and labor market volatility in Austria"
- analyze earnings volatility, labor market volatility, and earnings mobility in Austria using tax records

- A master's degree in economics or a related field or close to complete your studies with a strong academic record
- Excellent knowledge of micro-econometrics and experience in the analysis of microdata
- Excellent knowledge of statistical software (e.g. Stata, R, Python)

- Aiming to pursue a doctoral degree in economics with a focus in this area
