

Ladies and Gentlemen, dear colleagues!

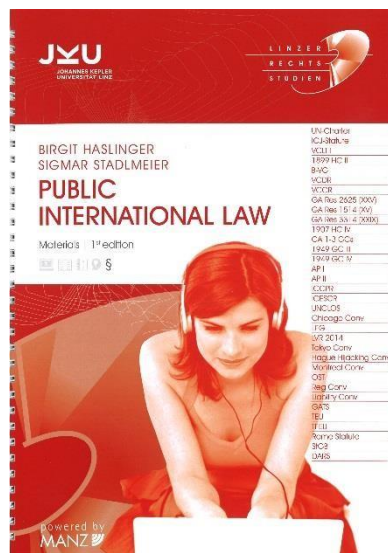
Please note the following information on the exam “Public International Law”:

1. For **entry requirements**, general information and an overview of the **syllabus** (i.e. the content of the exam) please refer to the “Studienhandbuch” (as you should always do before asking questions!) available under KUSSS.

2. Usually exams will be a combination of a knowledge test and a legal problem which you are expected to solve.

3. You may bring **unmarked copies of dictionaries** of your choice, as long as these are merely dictionaries and provide translations only. Dictionaries with in-depth explanations (such as the “Oxford Dictionary of Law”) are **not** permitted.

4. You may bring **uncommented copies** (*textmarkers, underlinings and references to paragraphs* are allowed, other annotations are not permitted!) of **basic treaties**, such as the collection “Haslinger / Stadlmeier, Public International Law / Materials”, powered by MANZ and available at bookstores. We do not suggest to bring collections of treaties in German as these will obviously be of very limited use when taking an exam in English.



5. Upon entering the room in which the exam is being held you must switch off your mobile phone or similar communication device and keep it in your bag or rucksack or whatever you carry with you. Any mobile phone out in the open will be regarded as an attempt to cheat. Your exam will not be graded, and you will be reported to the rectorate.
