



# Language Proficiency Exams C1/ Fachprüfungen Sprachbeherrschung 2023/24

#### 1. Dates

September 2023:

oral exam 13.09.2023 09.00 – 17.00 PHDL: Gebäude A; 2. OG; AS03, AS04, AS05

written exam 14.09.2023 09.00 – 12.00 PHDL: Gebäude A; EG; Hörsaal 1

Two more exam dates will be offered in January and April.

#### 2. Registration for September

Registration for September will be via PH-ONLINE (PHDL): Students must register for the exam **ASB4EN6SBP FP Sprachbeherrschung SS23**. Please make sure you register for the **exam** and not the course, you should be able to find it listed under 'Prüfungsan/abmeldung'. Registration is open until 04.09..

Information concerning the exam dates in January and April 2024 will be provided at the end of September.

Students must have received credits for the required courses Modules E B 5: Approaching C1 and E B 6: Consolidating C1, this includes credits for the course E B 6.2 PS Written Production II (4<sup>th</sup> semester), until 7 days prior to the exam at the latest. Until then registration can only be made provisionally.

## 3. Passed partial exam

Marks of previously passed partial exams will be kept for a maximum of 13 months. If students resit the exam within this period, they only need to retake the previously failed part of the C1 examination. There is no legal entitlement to the above and partial exam grades from Salzburg cannot be transferred to Linz or vice versa. #### 4. Examination format and assessment

The 'Fachprüfung Sprachbeherrschung' consists of:

- a. Oral exam (50% of the final grade)
  - i. Preparation (15 min): two prompts to choose from, students may use a monolingual dictionary
  - ii. Oral exam (5 min): a short talk on one topic in front of two examiners; students may use flashcards
  - iii. Assessment and feedback (5 min), based on level C1 of the CEFR

The exact exam schedule will be made available three days before the exam at the latest.

## b. Written exam (50% of the final grade):

- Text production (25%): Potential text types are argumentative essay, descriptive text, letter or email of complaint, as well as a blog response. Students may use one monolingual dictionary for the writing task. 400 words (+/-10%).
- ii. Language in use (25%): verb forms and collocations, vocabulary in use, grammar in use, text correction In order to pass the written exam, both language in use and text production must be positive.

### 5. Grades and feedback

Your final grades will show in PH-Online within a month after sitting the exam. Office hours in which you can look at your exam paper and receive feedback on the written part of the exam will be offered after grading has been completed.
