History and Future

The research seminar is based on a long established cooperation between two of the organizers (Prof. Bacher, Prof. Gorniak). This cooperation goes back to the 1980's, when Poland was part of the Comecon. The cooperation was enlarged stepwise, first by Nuremberg, where Prof. Bacher was head of the chair of sociology at the University Erlangen-Nuremberg. In a next step Skopje was included, based on a long cooperation between Cracow and Skopje (Prof. Mladenovski, Prof. Niezgoda).

The joint-seminars started in Linz (2008) and were continued in Cracow (2009) and Skopje (2010). Predecessors were research-seminars in Linz and Nuremberg.
